



FISHING

A Harmony fishing license is not required for OAH members. While we encourage catch and release at all times to sustain a healthy population of fish, any fish you have caught and intend to keep must be reported to the OAH.

Non-OAH members are not allowed to fish at this time.

Rules

- Fishing is only permitted during the hours of operation of the lake as set by the OAH;
- Daily fishing limits may be prescribed by the OAH, and is subjuect to change:
 - 2 per day, per household
 - A maximum of 6 per month, per household
 - A maximum of 50 per year, per household;
- Only barbless hooks must be used when fishing;
- Leave-in fishing nets are prohibited;
- Only one fishing rod per person is permitted;
- Cleaning of fish is not permitted on the lake, beach, public areas, or on OAH property;
- Fishing is only permitted from areas designated by the OAH, or on private watercraft. Lake shore lots and lake access lot owners are also permitted to fish from their respective docks.
- No fishing is permitted within 5m of beach areas.
- Catch and release is encouraged;
- Fish must be minimum 12in or 30cm to keep and must be reported to the OAH if kept. Email admin@harmonyowners.com.
- Feeding or baiting fish to lure them to a specific area within the lake is prohibited;

- Suggested bait:
 - cheese slices
 - artificial bait (e.g. power bait)
 - bread
 - fly-fishing flies
- Prohibited bait:
 - Corn
 - Fish (or anything that was previously alive)
